

A quick reminder to any member who is interested in being on the Wells Ogunquit Senior Center Board of Directors! Directors are elected at the Annual Meeting of Directors and Members which is held on the third Thursday in June each year at 4 pm in the center's function room.

The BOD at our March meeting appointed the nominating committee (per our election process) consisting of the Director, a Board member not running for reelection and a member in good standing from our center's membership. Appointed were, Rita Sevigny (Director), Larry Dyer (board member not running for reelection) and Stephanie Bennett, (a member at large in good standing). Thank you, Rita, Larry and Stephanie for doing this!

Application forms to file as a candidate to the board are available at the front desk on the first Monday in April, which is April 1st this year. Fill out form completely, attach or provide electronically a picture so members can see who they are voting for, and return completed form no later than the first Monday in May (May 6,2024).

We look forward to continuing to see those who have been here and those who are returning joining in the expanded activities for our warmer months!




