Message from the Board of Directors Greetings to all!

The WOCAM Board of Directors has voted in the new 2020 budget for our Center at our January 2020 Board of Directors Meeting. It is posted on the hallway bulletin board and if anyone wants a copy, please see the office or email <u>kathydhchase@hotmail.com</u> and I will send you a copy by email. Thank you to board members Ray Farnham (Vice Chair), Stephanie Bennett (Financial Administrator) and Jean Beattie (Secretary) who worked with me to complete the budget process, and Bob Robinson and Kendra Fowler for providing needed information.

Our budget -as any budget should be a financial guideline for future spending and income based on past actual spending and projected growth and needs. We have expanded programs for the coming year to reflect our increase in membership (Wells Ogunquit Senior Center has added 114 new members in 2019) and broader interests. We also addressed the cost of a new front door and set aside funding for investments. Kendra has been the leader in providing ideas that not only support member interest but add the funding to support the new programs. It will be a growing budget to address a growing membership, future financial security and building repairs.

The voted annual budget is also a needed document for our USDA mortgage loan, a tool for applying for grants and any other financial related reports that we must have in our corporate operations.

Our annual financial end of the 2019 year report from our accountants (RHR Smith)showed an excellent financial position for our mother corporation -The Senior Needs Committee of Wells and Ogunquit, our legal non-profit name and the Board of Directors salutes all our




